A year working hard for Hull North



Public Health Minister Caroline Flint MP joined me on a visit to see Hull's free healthy primary school meals policy in action at Parks Primary School. We also launched the new NHS Health Trainers scheme in Hull with Director of Public Health Wendy Richardson. I met the Chancellor Gordon Brown to discuss jobs and regeneration in Hull.

I visited residents in the Silverdale and Riversdale Road area to hear their views about the state of local roads. I also joined residents from the Newland Avenue area to discuss local road safety works. I had a tour of the improving NHS facilities at Castle Hill Hospital and Hull Royal Infirmary.

I asked ministers about the positive impact of the National Minimum Wage on jobs. There have been 1.7 million more jobs since its introduction in 1999. I support tough enforcement of the Minimum Wage against rogue employers. I also had a debate at Westminster on access to legal representation for Hull people and backed the Government's work against knife crime.

During Carers' Week, I paid another visit to see the excellent work of Hull Carers Centre. I support moves in Parliament to improve pensions for women and carers. I also backed the campaign by shopworkers' union USDAW for further action against the violence and abuse suffered by many shopworkers.

Culture Minister David Lammy MP joined me to visit Wilberforce House and see Hull's plans to mark the achievements of William Wilberforce. I opened the annual Bransholme Carnival and saw the work of Hull Animal Welfare Trust.

I lobbied the Royal Mail about the temporary closure of North Bransholme Post Office, which reopened in October. The Government recently announced annual investment of £1.7 billion in the Post Office network up to 2011 and is improving the Post Office Card Account. I went to Greenwood Library to support the Summer Holiday Reading project.

With Education Secretary Alan Johnson MP, I met children and staff at Pearson and Broadacre schools. I took Voluntary Sector Minister Ed Miliband MP to see the Hull Churches Home from Hospital service in Princes Avenue and the opening of Newland Avenue's new £2.2 million Community Church centre.

I became the 4000th member of Hull's Credit Union and backed moves in Parliament to crack down on the menace of illegal mini motos. George, my dog, was runner up in 'Westminster Dog of the Year', which promotes responsible pet ownership.

It was an honour to meet war veterans at Hull's Remembrance Sunday ceremony. With technology playing such an important part in the modern jobs market, it was a pleasure to see pupils at Cleeve Primary School in Bransholme working hard on their IT skills.

BBC TV's Peter Levy chose Amber Bentham of Bricknell Primary School as the winner of my Christmas Card Competition. Amber joined me in Westminster to deliver her winning card to 10 Downing Street. I called to see constituents in Bransholme who have had their central heating renewed under the 'Warm Homes' scheme.

With skilled jobs vital to future employment in Hull, I visited Brough's BAE Systems where the Hawk Trainer jet is built. I opened a new £2 million NHS health centre in Alexandra Road. I contacted the Home Secretary on local policing.

International Development Secretary Hilary Benn MP visited Hull's fair trade shop and supported the Wilberforce 2007 campaign against slavery. I met staff at the Stroke Unit at Hull Royal Infirmary and took part in Newland School for Girls' 'Democracy Morning'.
